Behavior Technicians work with toddlers, children, and/or teens diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder or other developmental disabilities in their home, school, and/or community utilizing Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) principles to teach communication skills, social skills, self-help skills, and play skills. Behavior Technicians work under the supervision of Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs). Training is provided to incoming candidates.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- High school diploma or GED required
- Students majoring in early childhood education, psychology, or social work is a plus
- Bachelor's degree in Applied Behavior Analysis,
 Psychology, Education, or related field is preferred
- Valid driver's license and an insured form of transportation (driving is required)
- Ability work with children who may engage in problem behaviors (i.e. tantrums, aggression)
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Experience with children and in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and Discrete Trial Training (DTT) is a plus
- Bilingual Candidates are a plus

- Provide behavioral therapy with individuals in their home, school, and/or community
- Follow and implement behavior plans
- Accurately record data for each program
- Engage in and ensure client safety
